Draft of a National or Regional Economy



Normal, needsoriented production for the domestic market (replacement demand and some innovation).

Subsistence Sector (economy based on responsible demand)

Not to be delivered to WTO, EU etc.

> National & subnational currencies or other protective or stimulating measures

Normal, stable trade with allied countries and regions. Alliances based on ecological and social criteria, e.g. full-cost pricing.

Diversity of production and hence of knowledge and skills. Secure employment and territorially bound circulation of money.

→ Enterprises can operate in both sectors, thus retaining a safe footing in the home sector.




Material basis


